We're in the lazy days of summer here in mid-Missouri. A time to take it easy and stay out of the heat.

But there's nothing lazy about the 30 Pacesetter companies who have already started their United Way Campaigns! Pacesetters are organizations who jumpstart the United Way of Central Missouri Campaign. They hold their internal workplace campaigns in July and August, before the Community Campaign takes place in September and October. These pacesetters truly lead the way and have already been strategizing and hosting events.

Missouri Farm Bureau held the first Pacesetter fundraiser of the summer back in May, hosting a Dine-to-Donate night at Texas Roadhouse. In June, we hosted a Trivia Night fundraiser, and in July we hosted a Color Me Mine painting fundraiser,

United Way & SSM Health Mid-Missouri Share Common Goals

At SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital, we cherish our partnership with United Way of Central Missouri. Their mission - much like our own - is to help people in tough, anxious and uncertain times. Their effort on behalf of 28 non-profit health and human service agencies, works for the health, education, financial stability and basic needs of every person in our community. Our common goals help to make central Missouri a better place for all.

SSM Health St. Mary's **Hospital History**

In the fall of 1902, two immigrant Catholic nuns arrived in Jefferson City by train from St. Louis. Their mission from the Franciscan Sisters of Mary was simple, yet bold; establish a hospital in Missouri's capital city, serving people of all faiths without regard to their financial or social standing. Sisters Mary Gertrude Sharrenbroich and Ildephonse Sommerhouser spent two years raising money from the community to build the hospital, at the same time caring for the sick in a makeshift hospital in a house on Elm Street. On Oct. 18, 1905, the city celebrated the dedication of the new St. Mary's Hospital, a four-story stone structure with 38 patient rooms, which was to become a cornerstone of

the community. Their presence remains through the purposeful care given by today's hospital employees. The mission has not wavered – "Through our exceptional health care services; we reveal the healing presence of God.

"A large majority of our employees say the mission is why they work here," said K.C. DeBoer, regional president for Mid-Missouri and president of SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital. "Our employees have always been concerned about helping our community."

Whether it was the nuns who arrived in Jefferson City or the staff who continue to carry out the mission of exceptional care and serving all patients regardless of their ability to pay, St. Mary's continues this tradition of helping our neighbors, caring for our community and offering support to those in need.

Providing Childcare Services for Families Who Need Us

Little Explorers Discovery Center (LEDC) is licensed for 99 children from birth to eight years of age. LEDC offers an accredited early childhood education program along with two meals and a snack for all children attending the Center. LEDC's doors are open to all children whose parents are either working or going to school, but gives priority to low-income working families. Childcare is made affordable for families with low income through a sliding fee scale based on a family's income.

Our youngest children are infants. LEDC provides ironfortified formula and baby food for infants and partners with the Capital City Diaper Bank to assist families with basic needs. Along with degreed or Child Development Associate (CDA) certified teachers LEDC has volunteers who provide hugs and snuggles for this very young population.

Our toddlers, including two and three year olds, enjoy many activities; including singing and dancing, art activities like coloring and painting, science, math, literacy activities, planting vegetables, comparing colors, shapes and sizes, listening to stories, and sensory exploration like playing in water and cooking experiences. In addition to enjoying lots of activities, our four, five and sixyear-old children take field trips to explore businesses and activities in our community like bowling, parks and a florist shop. All these activities are designed to increase body and brain development, help children feel secure and cared for, and help children successfully enter kindergarten.

LEDC doesn't do any of these activities alone; we're a United Way partner agency and rely on United Way support to keep our doors

open. Thanks to United Way, our parents working minimum wage jobs are able to go to work every day knowing their child is in a safe place and they are able to afford childcare. In addition to helping families that work minimum wage jobs, United Way is often the only help for those families that "fall between the cracks". Sometimes parents make just enough money to disqualify them for any type of assistance, but not enough to support their family. With a sliding fee scale with five different categories, these families will receive some assistance from United Way.

LEDC hosts Parent Classes for families attending the Center. These classes primarily focus on Conscious Discipline by giving parents tools to help understand, regulate and control their own emotions and behaviors as well as helping teach children how to selfregulate. These parent classes are sponsored through a grant from United Way and help families integrate positive discipline approaches at home, matching the same approaches used while their children are at the Center.

LEDC is part of the Early Childhood Initiative sponsored by United Way. Thanks to being were positive, and they feel a part of this initiative, our Center staff is trained in the use of Conscious Discipline and local Center directors get to meet together and discuss the successes and challenges of childcare as well as share

important information.

As a United Way agency, LEDC partners with other agencies to better care for our community's most vulnerable population. For example, The Sneaker Project provides a new pair of shoes for the children from low-income households. For many of these children this is their first new pair of shoes. The Boys and Girls Club allows LEDC to use one of their vans two mornings a week for field trips, stretching those United Way dollars even further. Salvation Army and Rape & Abuse Crisis Service (RACS) have both provided services to families attending the Center who are homeless or suffering from domestic abuse, and we assist families in shelters in need of childcare whenever possible. By working together, United Way partner agencies serve families and individuals living in poverty in many ways with a goal of helping these families and individuals work toward a better life.

LEDC has been a United Way agency for about 50 years. The best part about being in business for this many years is when helping families becomes full-circle. We have had many graduates return to the Center as parents. Even though they no longer need United Way support and are able to pay the full fee, they return because of their experiences as a child safe coming home. We are so grateful to provide our services thanks to the support of being a United Way of Central Missouri partner agency!



Expansion of Services for Those with Disabilities

Independent Living Resource Center (ILRC) first opened our doors in 1997 serving Cole, Southern Callaway, Moniteau, Miller, Morgan, Osage and Camden Counties. We are one of 22 Independent Living Centers in the state of Missouri and serve persons with disabilities including youth, young adults, the aging and veteran populations.

ILRC offers the Five Core Services; which includes Advocacy, Peer Support, Independent Living Skills, Information and Referral, and Transition. Additionally, we have programs designed to support our community such as Consumer Directed Services, Care Closet (offering needed cleaning and hygiene products to those who are in need), and our Durable Medical Equipment Program offering new and gently used equipment to individuals in

In 2018 we were the recipients of a United Way Community Support Grant allowing us to purchase a driver simulator. ILRC teaches drivers permit curriculum assisting individuals to prepare for the drivers permit exam. Once a permit is obtained, our driver simulator allows individuals to practice for their road test. These are just a few of our many added-

In addition to working one on one with individuals, we are developing a curriculum to include workshops featuring local

> nutritionists and chefs teaching specific dietary needs cooking classes and developing kitchen skills in those seeking greater independence.

Our kitchen will feature accommodating cooking utensils and assistive technology that will benefit many to learn the kitchen skills necessary to care for themselves. We are so thankful for our many business partners who are working hard to remodel and supply our kitchen; including Meeks Lumber Company, Lages Cabinet Shop, Kitchen Craft, Bernskoetter Plumbing, Stokes Electrical, Coleman Appliances and more.

ILRC is embarking on a new path this year expanding services and increasing community outreach. We are underway of a much-needed facelift in our Center and will be hosting an open house for all to attend in the fall and learn more about our consumers and center. We are so appreciative of United Way of Central Missouri for selecting us as one of the many outstanding agencies that was awarded grant funding this year, and we are looking forward to this incredible expansion of services for our consumers.

Making It Happen for **Our Youth**

This year Boys & Girls Club of Jefferson City marks 28 years of afterschool and summer programming for youth in our community. During that time, the need for its growth and the importance of its services for our youth are more evident than ever. The past year is a perfect case for why the Club is so needed and how, over the last three decades, staff, board members, community partners like United Way, and investors have kept their eyes on the future and remained dedicated to expanding services to all youth in our community.

In the spring of 2022, with continued waitlists at multiple sites, the Club began searching for a new location to expand services on the West side of the community. When an ideal location was found in May, staff and board members wasted no time in purchasing the building and property. Our unwritten motto is "Make it happen," and this plan was no different. After a sixty-day remodel, the Club opened the new facility in August. Purchasing, remodeling and opening a new facility for 175 children in less than ninety days would take a miracle. Yet again, the Club, with the support of our community at our back, has seen many miracles for our youth. The new Sadowski Center opened last fall and just completed its first very successful school year. It continues that success and building on our mission to serve more children by allowing the Club to offer a second summer camp location. It also doubles the amount of children that can be served every summer.

The Club didn't stop there. While the Sadowski Center is serving youth for the first time this summer, the Club has expanded its commitment to our teens as well. For the first time ever, our middle and high school-aged Club members have a full summer long camp instead of just the month of June this year. This expansion furthers our investment and commitment to teens in our community. For the past few years, one of our priorities has been to better serve our teen population and increase the number of teens in our program who need our support. The Club has made investments in high-end STEM activities for teens that includes robotics, 3D printing, esports programming, a recording studio, and even virtual reality career exploration goggles. The primary

focus for our teens at the Boys & Girls Club is to help guide their success and offer a variety of experiences and programs that engage them in thinking about their future and what that successful future looks like to them. This expanded program during the summer helps to provide continuity of our programming for teens and has already proven itself to be a great success with a 59% increase in teen enrollment since last year.

All of this growth is only possible because of the continued support of our community, and we have no greater community partner than United Way of Central Missouri. United Way not only funds a large share of the scholarship program that allows those youth who cannot afford the program to attend, their funding has also supported many necessary items over the years. Items like vehicles to transport kids home who don't have reliable transportation in their family, kitchen equipment to provide meals so no child goes home hungry, or temporary walls to divide spaces and keep kids safe during COVID. We are so appreciative of the continued support from United Way and its donors that helps ensure we partner with other United Way member agencies like Little Explorers Discovery Center, the Sneaker Project, or Dreams to Reality to make those funds go father for those in need in our community. We are all stronger when we Live United together!

The growth of our programs is vital to the success of our mission to enable all youth to become responsible, caring and productive citizens in our community. However, the programming, experiences, mentoring and support offered by the Club are the true recipe of what makes the Club successful in that mission. There is no better example of the success of our programming and our mission than Teen Center member Malani Morris, a 13-year-old who attends Lewis & Clark Middle School. Malani has attended the Club for over 4 years. She is a remarkable young woman who personifies all of the qualities that we encourage in a Club Kid. She is involved in her community, shines academically, and is truly engaged in the Club and has grown from her experience with us. Earlier this year, Malani represented the Club in Boys & Girls Club of America's premier leadership program in Missouri as a Jr. Youth of the Year candidate. The Youth of the Year program consists of Club youth representing their hometown Clubs from across the state with essays and speeches. The program concludes with a winner announced each April in the Capital City. Candidates also get to the meet the Governor, their representatives, receive a proclamation from the Missouri Senate, and share their Club experience.

Malani did an excellent job representing our community and our Club. She was announced as the 2023 Jr. Youth of the Year for Missouri! She begins a legacy for our Club and community as the first-ever winner from Jefferson City. We are so proud of her and were humbled as she shared her experience at the Club, speaking eloquently about the support from staff, the time she gets to bond with friends she doesn't see at school, and how the accepting and empowering environment at the Club has set her up for success in her future. This is why all of us at the Boys & Girls Club of Jefferson City do the work we do, because youth are our future, and we owe it to them to clear obstacles, empower them, and set them up for a successful future. Looking at the past three decades of support, growth and success at the Club, now more than ever, I feel confident our community's future is in good hands with our youth!


