




our financials

Other Revenue includes income generated from the sale of promotional materials, special events and miscellaneous activities.



2022 Expenses \$2,444,200

Agency Allocations, Programs & Initiatives are costs related to funding United Way of Central Missouri's programs that promote health, education, financial stability and basic needs.

Community Support Grants are costs related to grant investments to any qualifying health and human service 501(c)(3) to address immediate, critical, unmet needs or to help with an emerging need.

General & Administrative Expenses are costs related to administering the day-to-day activities of United Way of Central Missouri.

Disaster Recovery Expenses are costs related to intermediate and long-term disaster recovery efforts.

COVID Response Expenses are costs related to COVID response efforts.





United Way of Central Missouri has championed the Early Childhood Initiative for over ten years. Through this initiative we support early childhood programs in the central Missouri area to ensure children birth through 5 years old receive quality early learning opportunities, aid parents in positive parenting practices and support strong transition programming into kindergarten.

The United Way of Central Missouri Early Childhood Initiative:

- supports early childhood programs
- provides Conscious Discipline and other training to early childhood providers, agencies, elementary schools and parents
- collaborates with the Jefferson City Area Chamber of Commerce workforce coalition
- participates in the Regional Leadership Team with the State of Missouri Office of Childhood
- increases awareness of early childhood and elevates the early childhood profession.

Conscious Discipline provides a proven and comprehensive approach to discipline that empowers parents and early childhood professionals with the self-awareness, brain information, developmental knowledge and usable skills necessary to create safe, connected, problem-solving skills so children can self-regulate and improve their overall social and emotional skills.

- ✓ Launched Partners in Education pilot program with Jefferson City Area Chamber of Commerce to support local Early Childhood Centers
- ✓ Launched Conscious Discipline pilot program with 6 local area elementary schools
- ✓ Provided 21 Early Childhood trainings with nearly 300 attendees
- ✓ Increased engagement with Early Childhood Community Leaders in Cole, Osage, Moniteau and Miller counties



In late summer...

Women United came together for a social networking event at BarVino – where ladies had the opportunity to meet new friends, have fun and get to know one another.



In early fall...

Women United was approached with an opportunity to coordinate a backpack donation program between the Public Service Commission and ABLÉ students. Thanks to generous donations from the Public Service Commission, Women United purchased 48 backpacks and stuffed them with back to school supplies. These backpacks were then given to ABLÉ tutors, who gifted them to their students to begin the new school year.

In late fall...

Women United hosted its annual signature fundraiser, Power of the Purse. This year's event offered online bidding for the silent auction with the live auction taking place during the in-person event. Approximately 100 silent auction purses were available for purchase—ranging from upscale, brand-name purses to unique, vintage collectibles. The high-value live auction bags were modeled by gentlemen from our community. Additional event components included a wine pull, a jewelry pull and permanent jewelry linking.
